US: EXTENDED STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS FOR SANCTIONS SNEAKS INTO FOREIGN AID BILL

On 25 April, an article from Wilkie Farr & Gallagher LLP was concerned with the doubling the statute of limitations of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) and the Trading With the Enemy Act (TWEA) from 5 years to 10 years. The extended statutes of limitations became effective immediately upon the signing of the bill into law on 24 April and will have far-reaching consequences for multinational companies and anyone else with exposure to US sanctions and certain export controls.

It sanctioned the speaker of the Ugandan parliament, Anita Among, and 2 high-profile Ugandan lawmakers, targeting corruption in the east African country for the first time with its sanctions regime. The Isle of Man followed suit.

EncroChat: THE EU COURT OF JUSTICE CLARIFIES THE CONDITIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION AND USE OF EVIDENCE IN CRIMINAL CASES WITH A CROSS-BORDER DIMENSION

On 30 April, a news release from CJEU e clarifies certain conditions for the transmission and use of evidence under the Directive regarding the European Investigation Order (EIO) in criminal matters. The French police were able, with the assistance of Dutch experts and the authorisation of a French court, to infiltrate the encrypted telecommunications service EncroChat - a service used worldwide on encrypted mobile phones for the purpose of illegal drug trafficking. The Regional Court of Berlin, before which criminal proceedings were brought, queries the lawfulness of the EIO, and submitted to the Court of Justice a series of questions for a preliminary ruling on the Directive regarding the European Investigation Order in criminal matters.
